RACIAL PROFILING

The Double Oak Police Department (DOPD) prohibits the practice of racial profiling and has established policies, provided training to its officers, and instituted a process to monitor traffic stops. Discrimination in any form, including racial profiling, is strictly prohibited and the department will take immediate and appropriate action to investigate allegations of discrimination.

STATISTICS SUMMARY

DOPD conducted 1664 traffic stops in 2020, 46.87% fewer stops than the previous year. Traffic stops were most often a result of moving traffic violations (1445) and searches (24) were conducted in 1.17% of all stops. Contraband (14) was found .85% of the time. In all, DOPD effected 0 arrests, issued 1109 tickets, and 555 warnings as a result of traffic stops in 2020. Zero (0) racial profiling complaint was filed against DOPD during the reporting period.

- 1) clearly defines acts constituting racial profiling;
- 2) strictly prohibits peace officers employed by the <u>DOUBLE OAK_POLICE DEPT.</u> from engaging in racial profiling;
- 3) implements a process by which an individual may file a complaint with the <u>DOUBLE OAK POLICE DEPT</u>, if the individual believes that a peace officer employed by the <u>DOUBLE OAK POLICE DEPT</u>, has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual;
- 4) provides public education relating to the agency's complaint process;
- 5) requires appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the <u>DOUBLE OAK POLICE DEPT</u>, who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the <u>DOUBLE OAK POLICE DEPT</u>, policy;
- 6) requires collection of information relating to motor vehicle stops in which a warning or citation is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:
 - a. the race or ethnicity of the individual detained;
 - b. whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the individual detained consented to the search;
 - c. whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before detaining that individual;
 - d. whether the peace officer used physical force that resulted in bodily injury during the stop;
 - e. the location of the stop;
 - f. the reason for the stop.
- 7) requires the chief administrator of the agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, to submit an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) to:
 - a. the Commission on Law Enforcement; and
 - b. the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency, if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.
