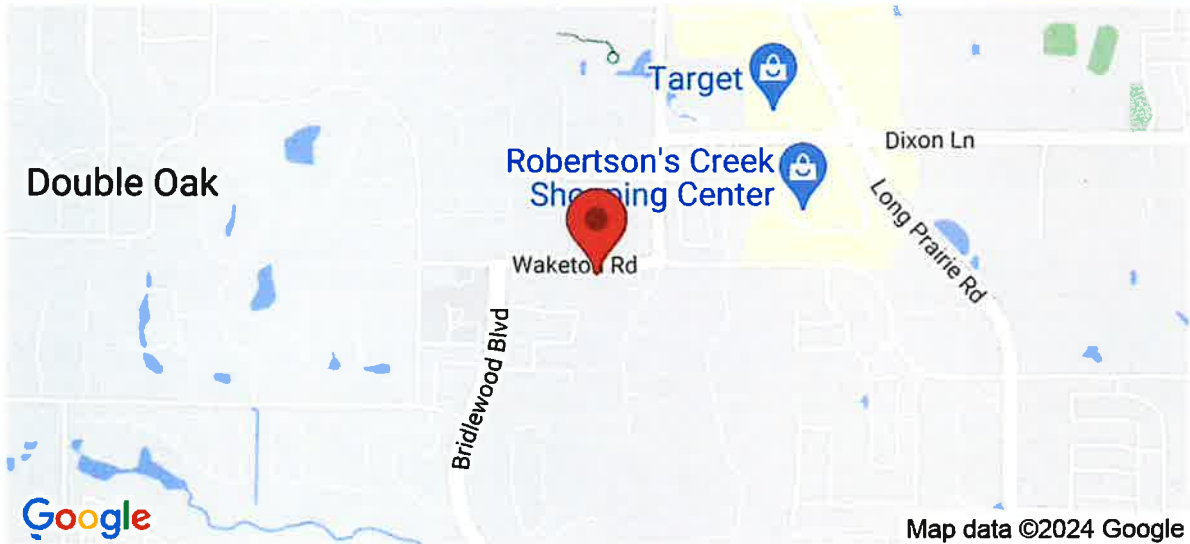

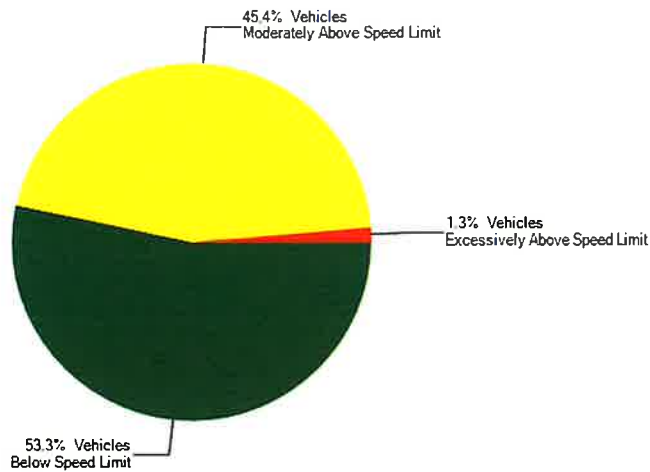

THE USE OF NIGHT VISION DEVICES IN LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFERS MANY BENEFITS FOR THE PATROL OFFICER IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES. THE INCREASE IN DEMAND FOR NIGHT VISION DEVICES IS REACHING FAR PAST TRADITIONAL ROLES IN THE LAW ENFORCEMENT COMMUNITY. NO LONGER JUST A TOOL FOR TACTICAL TEAMS, OR OTHER SPECIALIZED UNITS, NIGHT VISION TECHNOLOGY SHOULD BE CONSIDERED AN ESSENTIAL AND VERSATILE TOOL TO INCREASE OPERATIONAL SUCCESS AND OFFICER SAFETY.

ADVANTAGES OF USING NIGHT VISION DEVICES IN LAW ENFORCEMENT

Night Vision Devices not only help in identifying subjects, but also improve officer safety by giving officers the advantage in night-time or low light scenarios. 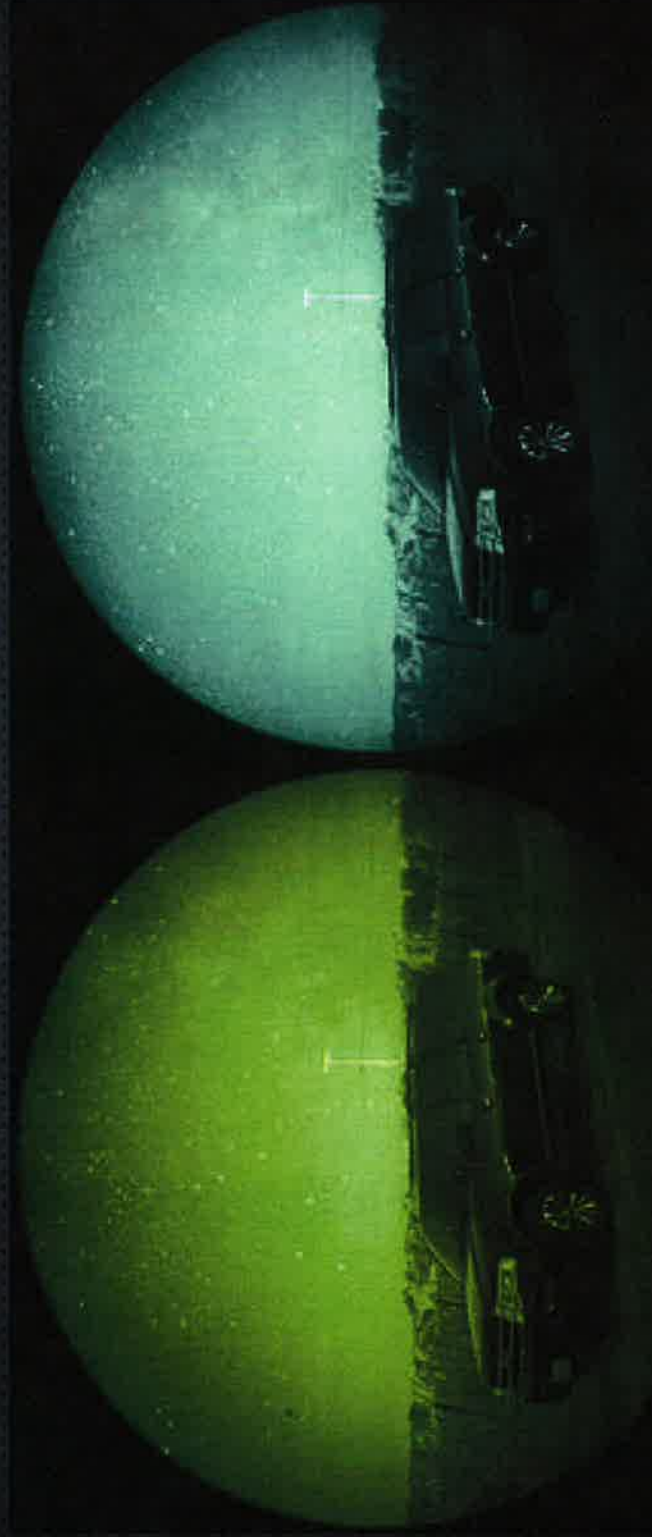

The PVS-14 Night Vision Monocular System is the most versatile night vision monocular available today. It is currently in use with all branches of the United States Military as well as many Law Enforcement Agencies. It can be used handheld, weapon mounted or helmet mounted. It is also the preferred night vision optic for many foreign NATO forces.

It allows the user to view their surroundings in full Gen 3 night vision detail while maintaining their natural vision in their unaided eye.
