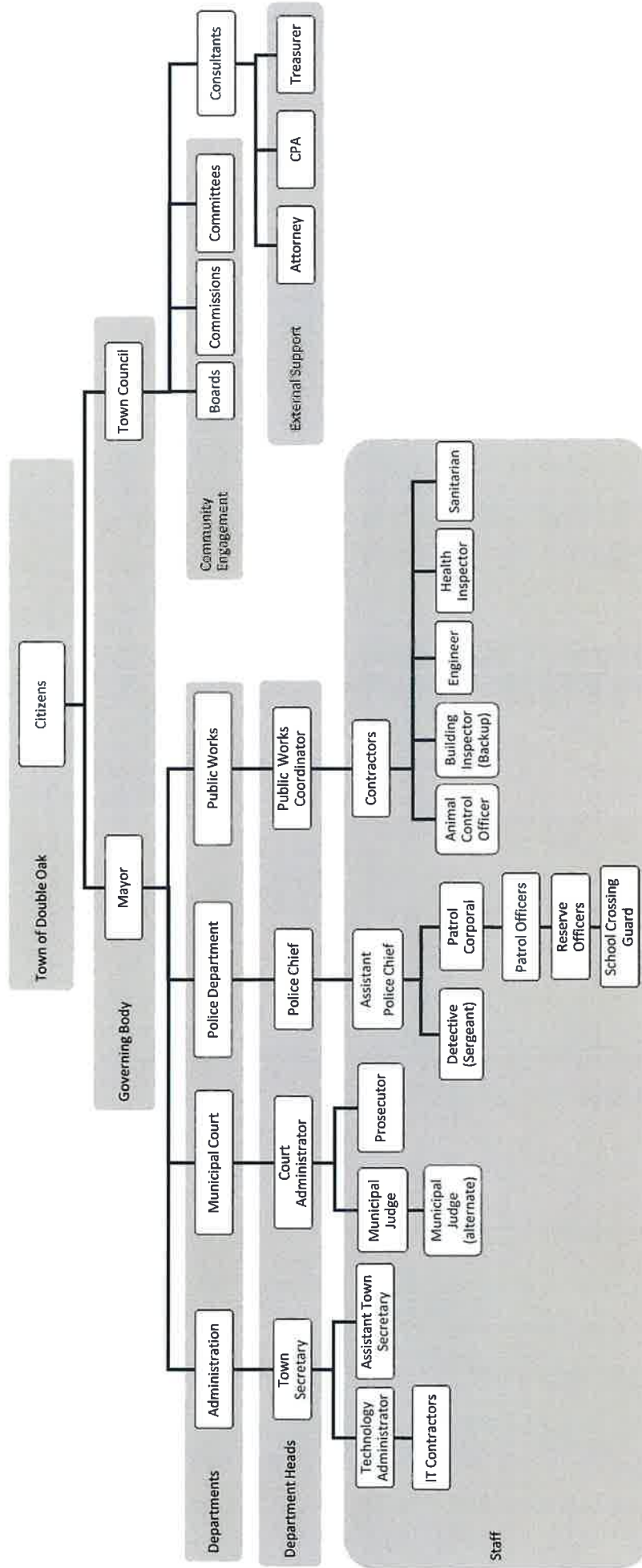

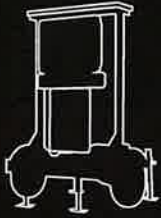

## Double Oak Boards, Commissions, and Committees Overview\*

### Board of Adjustments – Active

**Phyllis Meyerson – Chair; Candy Lamel – Co-Chair**

The Board of Adjustment hears requests for variances from the comprehensive zoning ordinance, and from other ordinances, as specified in the town’s Code. This is an actionable appeal board, and decisions by this board cannot be overturned by the Town Council, but only in County Court. This Board meets on an as-needed basis only. 11 members serve staggered 2-year terms, with five designated as voting members, and six alternates. (Currently 4 open alternate positions)

### Planning and Zoning Commission – Active

**Andrew Weaver – Chair; Wayne Atkins – Vice Chair**

The Planning and Zoning Commission develops and revises town zoning ordinances and addresses other items at the request of the Town Council. This is a working body that recommends decisions to the Town Council for action. Seven members serve staggered 2-year terms, voting on decisions, and there are four alternates. (Currently 1 open alternate position)

### 50<sup>th</sup> Birthday Committee – Active

**Bonnie Morrow – Chair**

The 50<sup>th</sup> Birthday Committee is a special purpose committee charged with planning and coordinating the activities for Double Oak’s 50<sup>th</sup> Birthday Celebration in May 2024. The committee is comprised of 6 members. The committee meets at town hall on the 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of each month at 7 p.m. This committee will sunset in June 2024.

## **Proposal to activate the Double Oak Citizens Commission as outlined in the town ordinances.**

### **Double Oak Citizens Commission - Inactive**

The Double Oak Citizens Commission hears, considers, and gives recommendations to the mayor on citizens' complaints or concerns related to staff, contractors, or council. Five members serve staggered 2-year terms and there are two alternates.

### **Town Ordinances - Articles 1.1100**

#### **§ 1.1101. Establishment of Commission; Qualifications of Members.**

(a) There is hereby created and established the Double Oak Citizens Commission for the town consisting of five (5) members appointed by the town council. In addition to the five (5) regular members, two (2) alternate members of the Double Oak Citizens Commission will be appointed to serve in the absence of one or more regular members when requested to do so by the mayor or chairman of the commission.

(b) The Double Oak Citizens Commission shall select one of its regular members to serve as the chairman, and one of its regular members to be vice chairman to serve in the absence of the chairman, at the first regular meeting following October 1 of each year. No regular member shall be qualified to serve as chairman or vice chairman unless that member has first served on the commission for a period of at least six (6) months.

(c) Each regular and alternate member shall be a resident of the town, shall be qualified to vote, and shall forfeit his office should he cease to reside in the town during his term of office. Each regular and alternate member must have been, as of his date of appointment, a resident of the town for a continuous period of not less than six (6) months, hold no other paid, incompatible, or elected public office for the town, and shall not be in arrears in the payment of taxes or any liability due the town, unless such arrears in the payment of taxes are the subject of a properly filed and pending protest

(Ordinance 05-21, sec. 3, adopted 6/6/05)

#### **§ 1.1102. Terms of Office; Vacancies; Removal.**

(a) The term of office of regular and alternate members of the commission shall be for two (2) years. Two (2) regular members and one (1) alternate member shall be appointed to two-year terms beginning on October 1 in even numbered years and three (3) regular members and one (1) alternate member shall be appointed for two-year terms beginning on October 1 in odd numbered years. The town council shall make appointments to the Double Oak Citizens Commission at its second regular monthly meeting in August of each year or as soon thereafter as possible.

(b) In the event of a vacancy on the commission, the alternate member with the longest tenure shall, without further formal action, become a regular member until the expiration of the term of the office assumed by the alternate member. In the event of a vacancy in two (2) offices, the alternate member with the longest tenure shall assume the office of the member with the longest remaining term of office. In the event of any vacancy on the commission, the town council shall appoint new members to fill the vacant offices as soon as practicable to fill such vacancies for the remainder of the unexpired terms of office.

(c) Members of the commission serve at the pleasure of the town council and may be removed from office by the town council by simple majority vote.

(Ordinance 05-21, sec. 3, adopted 6/6/05)

#### **1.1103. Powers and Duties.**

(a) Meetings of the commission shall be held as often as necessary to conduct the business of the commission at the call of the chairman and at such other times as the commission may

determine. A majority of three (3) members of the commission, whether regular or alternate, shall constitute a quorum to conduct business. Alternate members may vote on matters before the commission only in the absence of regular members when requested to do so by the mayor or presiding officer of the commission.

(b) Unless a closed session is requested by the affected employee or contractor, meetings of the commission should be open to the public and the commission shall keep minutes of the proceedings showing the vote of each member upon each question coming before the commission. The minutes of the commission shall be public records. Any findings, determinations, conclusions or recommendations will be made in open session.

(c) The commission shall be responsible for informing the complainant of the commission's findings and recommendations.

(Ordinance 09-10 adopted 7/20/09)

### **Proposal to eliminate/sun set the conservation/tree committee.**

The role and duties of this committee are already covered under the Planning and Zoning committee and the Permit Application Review duties of the Public works director per town ordinances.

### **Article 3.1500 – Tree Preservation**

#### **§ 3.1501. Purpose.**

(a) The purposes of this article are to establish rules and regulations governing the protection of trees and

vegetation cover within the Town of Double Oak, to encourage the protection of healthy trees and vegetation, and to provide for replacement and replanting of trees that are necessarily removed during construction, development or redevelopment.

(b) The provisions of this article allow trees located within necessary public rights-of-way and easements to be removed prior to issuance of a building permit. Trees within the buildable area of a property may also be removed. All other tree removal is subject to the permit requirements of Section 3.1505 hereof.

(c) In compliance with the spirit and intent of this article, residential property owners are encouraged to assist in the identification and preservation of historic and specimen trees that may exist on their property. Advice in this regard may be obtained from the town secretary, building inspector and/or the planning and zoning commission.

(Ordinance 40-A adopted 3/21/00)

#### **§ 3.1507. Permit - Application Review.**

Where an application is submitted in conjunction with development applications for new subdivisions, preliminary plans, and plat applications, the planning and zoning commission shall review the application as part of the plan or plat review process, subject to review and approval by the town council. The building inspector shall review applications for previously approved or platted lots. Such reviews may include a field inspection of the site and the application may be referred to such departments as deemed appropriate for review and recommendations. If the application is made in conjunction with a site plan submitted for approval, the application will be considered as part of the site plan; and no permit shall be issued without site plan approval. Following review and inspection, the permit applications will be approved, disapproved, or approved with conditions by the planning and zoning commission or building inspector, as appropriate, in accordance with the provisions of this article.

(Ordinance 40-A adopted 3/21/00)

**Proposal to restructure/combine the Town Hall Renovations Committee and the Town Beautification Committee into the Town Buildings and Grounds Committee.**

This committee will audit the condition of the building and grounds, to include any property owned or maintained by the town and give recommendations for renovations and upkeep to the town council for consideration and action. The Public Works Director will act as staff advisor for this committee.

**Proposal to establish a Drainage Committee separate from the Roads Committee.**

This committee will be charged with taking the findings from the drainage study and working with town engineers, the Public Works Director, and citizens to prioritize the projects and give recommendations to the town council on prioritized projects and expected costs. At least one committee member will be a liaison to the Roads Committee and the Roads Committee may appoint a liaison to the Drainage Committee. When drainage issues are impacted by roads, or the prioritized drainage projects will impact roads, the Drainage Committee Chair and the Roads Committee Chair can convene joint committee meetings.

### Council Liaison Appointments

Liaison is defined as to perform as neither an advocate nor an opponent but rather to act as a conduit for organizations, staff, boards, commissions, committee, etc. To facilitate communication between Council and entity without prejudice.
